Summary of the PROGRESS Programme

Background

PROGRESS is the EU's employment and social solidarity programme. It falls under the jurisdiction of the DG for Employment, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities. It is designed to work alongside ESF and supports the EU's efforts to deliver growth and more jobs whilst fighting poverty and social exclusion. It is designed to support policy development and delivery in five areas:-

- Employment
- Social inclusion and protection
- Working conditions
- Non-discrimination
- Gender equality

Objectives

PROGRESS has six general objectives. These are:

- To improve the knowledge and understanding of Member States' situation through analysis, evaluation and close monitoring of policies
- To support the development of statistical tools, methods and common indicators in the areas covered by the programme
- To support and monitor the implementation of Community law and policy objectives in the member States to assess their effectiveness and impact
- To promote networking and mutual learning and identify and disseminate good practices and innovative approaches at EU level
- To enhance stakeholder and general public awareness about each policy area
- To boost the capacity of key EU networks to promote, support and further develop EU policies and objectives
- To promote gender mainstreaming into all sections and activities of PROGRESS

Activities

PROGRESS provides funding support for three types of activities:-

- Analytical activities – (data/statistics; indicators; studies; impact assessments)
- Mutual learning, awareness and dissemination – (best practices and peer review; media campaigns and events)
- Support to main actors – (support to key EU networks; working groups; training seminars; experts' networks; EU level observatories; exchange of personnel; cooperation with international institutions)

Budget and Management

The budget available for PROGRESS in 2010 is €108.09m, which will be allocated across the 5 policy areas as follows:-

The remaining €1.79m is allocated to support the administration of the Programme.

The Commission issues an annual work plan for the PROGRESS Programme, which indicates how the different aspects of the programme will be implemented. Some elements of the work plan are designed to be delivered by government departments or specific agencies in each of the Member States but other elements are open to other organisations to participate. For these elements the Commission has two methods of selecting projects:-

- **Calls for tenders** – whereby it contracts with an organisation to deliver a project at a price negotiated
- **Calls for proposals** – whereby grants are awarded for projects up to a maximum of 80% of the total cost.

Opportunities for HEIs

Higher Education Institutions and Research Institutes are identified as eligible participants in the programme and indeed some of the activities identified in the work plan call specifically for HEI involvement.

By far the most significant opportunities for HEIs will be research related activities, although there is some scope for HEIs to be involved in other activities such as training pilots, dissemination of best practice, promotion and networking. Opportunities will be very specific, aiming to target a particular issue or area of policy development.

The work plan for 2010 identifies 27 potential opportunities for HEIs to tender to undertake work on behalf of the Commission. With regard to calls for proposals, there are 3 calls which may be of interest to HEIs, the Commission aims to select up to 14 projects under these calls. A table showing details of all the calls perceived to be relevant to HEIs has been produced and is provided elsewhere in this Bulletin.

Background

The work plan for Progress in 2010 identifies 125 activities. Some of these activities will be undertaken through a renewal of existing contracts, others will be the subject of calls for proposals or tenders in 2010. It is envisaged that there will be 8 calls for proposals and 30 calls for tenders.

Opportunities for UK HEIs

We have analysed the work plan and identified a number of calls for proposals and tenders that may be of interest to UK HEIs. Most are concerned with the delivery of studies and policy analyses and will be the subject of specific calls for tender to be announced later in the year.

Background

The Entrepreneurship & Innovation Programme (EIP) forms a part of the Competitiveness and Innovation Programme (CIP). It aims to support innovation and SMEs through a variety of measures which include the following:-

- Access to finance for SMEs in different phases of their lifecycles, contributing towards technological development, innovation and eco-innovation, technology transfer and the cross border expansion of business activities;
- Business services, through the Enterprise Europe Network;
- Support for improving innovation policy through transnational networking and exchange of best practice;
- Eco-innovation pilot and market replication projects for the testing in real conditions of innovative products, processes and services aimed at reducing environmental impacts, preventing pollution or achieving a more efficient use of natural resources;
- Support for innovation and SME policy making, analytical and awareness raising activities on certain industrial sectors, SMEs or innovation policy etc.

2010 Work Programme

The EIP budget for 2010 is around €335.3m, spread across the Programme's six objectives as follows:-

EIP Objective	Amount
1. Access to finance for the start-up and growth of SMEs and investment in innovation activities	€169.3m
2. Creation of an environment favourable to SME cooperation	€76.7m
3. All forms of innovation in enterprises	€3.7m
4. Eco-innovation	€77.7m

6. Enterprise and innovation related economic and administrative reform	€3.2m

Funds are to be allocated through a variety of means including directly to SMEs through the European Investment Fund; to existing partnerships, for example, members of the Enterprise Europe Network; and through calls for tenders and calls for proposals.

Opportunities for HEIs

An analysis of the work programme reveals a number of potential opportunities that may be of interest to UK HEIs. The table below sets out the main opportunities, the amount of funding available and the proposed timetable for the announcement of calls.

European Network of Female Entrepreneurship Ambassadors

Deadline: 12 March 2010

ENT/CIP/09/E/N08S003

Background

This call for proposals is a follow-up to a call announced early in 2009 which was restricted to Enterprise Europe Network partners across the EU. It is managed by the Executive Agency for Competitiveness and Innovation (EACI) on behalf of the European Commission. The 2009 call resulted in applications from only 10 of the eligible countries. The purpose of this call, therefore, is to spread coverage of the Network to all the remaining countries, one of which is the UK.

Through the Network of Female Entrepreneurship Ambassadors, the Commission is seeking to boost the rate of female entrepreneurial activity across the EU. The call is addressed to ‘organisations active in business support’¹ that will, as a consortium, set up a national network, to bring together successful entrepreneurs across Europe to work locally and nationally to inspire and encourage women to recognise that entrepreneurship could be a career path for them.

Activities to be supported

Each project will set up a national network, together the national networks will constitute the European network. Each applicant must identify potential ambassadors and specify target groups. Ambassadors will participate in conferences, discussions, workshops and other events aimed at promoting female entrepreneurship. For example, ambassadors might speak to groups in schools, colleges, universities, community groups and the media, as well as addressing conferences, business networks and employment initiatives.

Opportunities for HEI involvement

The definition of ‘organisations active in business support’ set out in footnote 1 would seem to allow for HEI involvement as applicants. In particular, business support units/centres/departments etc. would be eligible to apply. This call may also be of interest to certain relevant academic or other networks in which colleagues in HEIs might be involved.

As set out below, the amount of grant available is very small, each project expected to receive somewhere in the region of around €50,000. Fees to ambassadors will not be an eligible cost, and match funding in kind is not applicable. It would seem, therefore, that the grant would, in the main, be considered as a contribution to the management of the network and to the travel and subsistence costs incurred by the ambassadors.

Technical Issues

- Maximum duration of support is 24 months, after this time the participating partners are expected to take over the management of each national network to ensure its continuation.
- Scheduled start date is August 2010
- Total amount available for this call is €545,000
- Average amount of grant per project is likely to be only €50,000
- Grant rate is 50% of eligible costs

EU- Canada Cooperation Programme in HE, Training and Youth

Call for Proposals

Transatlantic Exchange Partnerships and Transatlantic Degree Partnerships

Deadline: 24 March 2010

EACEA/30/09

Background

The general objectives of the programme are to promote mutual understanding between people of the EU and Canada, including broader knowledge of their languages, cultures and institutions and to improve the quality of human resources in the EU and Canada.

The Higher Education elements of the Programme allow for the development of curricula, joint study programmes, international internships, exchanges and study abroad with provision for mutual credit recognition and language and cultural preparation. The main focus of activities must be on transatlantic rather than intra-European or intra- Canadian interactions.

Types of Activities

There are 2 types of activities covered by this call, as follows:-

Transatlantic Exchange Partnerships (TEP)

Support is provided to enable EU-Canada consortia of HEIs to carry out joint study and training programmes and to implement student and staff mobility. Support includes a contribution to the cost of administration, grants to students and members of academic and administrative staff.

Transatlantic Degree Partnerships (TDP)

Support is provided to develop and implement dual/double or joint degree programmes. Support includes a contribution towards the development work and administration, grants for students and members of academic and administrative staff.

Technical Issues

Duration

For TEPs the maximum duration is 36 months

For TDPs the maximum duration is 48 months.

Consortia

Projects must have a lead EU Institution and a lead Canadian Institution, each is responsible for submitting the common proposal and for managing the project.

The consortium must involve at least 4 HEIs in total – 2 from the EU; 2 from Canada.

Funding available

The European Commission will provide funding for the direct use of the EU partners and the Department of Human Resources and Skills Development (HRSDC) will

provide funding for the direct use of Canadian partners. The total funding amounts available for individual partnerships are expected to be as follows:-

For TEPs - a maximum of €138,000 for the EU partners
a maximum of CAN\$200,000 for the Canadian partners

For TDPs - a maximum of €428,000 for the EU partners
a maximum of CAN\$450,000 for the Canadian partners

It is expected that the funding available for 2010 (around €1.9m) will be allocated to support 5 TEPs and 3 TDPs.

Application procedure

Applicants from the EU and the US must include in their application forms a 'common proposal narrative' that must be submitted to both the EU agency (EACEA) and the HRSDC in Canada.

EU-US Cooperation Programme in HE and Vocational Training

Call for Proposals

ATLANTIS – Actions for Transatlantic Links and Academic Networks in Training and Integrated Studies

Deadline: 8 April 2010

EACEA/31/09

Background

The EU-US Cooperation Agreement in HE and Vocational Education and Training aims to promote understanding between the people of the EU and the USA and to improve the quality of human resource development. ATLANTIS supports innovative projects for cooperation in HE and VET which are designed to develop and implement double or joint transatlantic degrees for students in the EU and US and other forms of cooperation including mobility and policy oriented measures.

The specific objectives of ATLANTIS are to:-

- Enhance collaboration between the EU and US in HE and VET
- Contribute to the development of HE and VET institutions
- Contribute to individual participants' personal development for their own sake and as a way to achieve the general objective of the programme
- And contribute to transatlantic exchanges between EU and US citizens

Operationally, the objectives are to:-

- Support collaboration between HE and VET institutions with a view to promoting joint study programmes and mobility
- Improve quality of transatlantic student mobility by promoting transparency, mutual recognition of qualifications and periods of study and training, and, where appropriate, portability of credits
- Support collaboration between public and private organisations active in the field of HE and VET with a view to encouraging discussion and exchange of experience on policy issues
- Support transatlantic mobility of professionals with a view to improving mutual understanding of issues relevant to EU-US relations.

Types of Activities

There are 3 types of activities covered by this call, as follows:-

Action 1 Transatlantic Degree Consortia Projects

Support for consortia of EU and US HEIs to implement double/dual or joint degree programmes referred to as 'Transatlantic Degrees' (bachelors and masters level). Support includes mobility grants to students and members of academic and administrative staff.

Action 2 Excellence in Mobility Projects

Support for international curriculum development projects that involve short-term transatlantic mobility not directly related to the award of a double/dual or joint degree (bachelors and masters level). Support includes mobility grants for students and members of academic and administrative staff. These projects must include for all

students a diploma supplement from the EU Institution and a comparable description of the programme of study by the US institution.

Action 3 Policy Oriented Measures

Support to multilateral EU-US projects and activities designed to enhance collaboration in the HE and vocational training field. Proposals in the following areas are particularly encouraged:-

- Access to HE and to international exchanges
- University-industry cooperation
- Recognition of degrees and qualifications
- HE and lifelong learning
- Comparing and tuning learning outcomes and competences to enhance comparability and transparency of educational structures and programmes
- HE reforms in Europe and in the US and their implications for cooperation and mobility
- Credit accumulation and transfer systems
- Quality measurement, accreditation and quality assurance
- Accountability and assessment in HE

Technical Issues

Duration

Projects funded under Actions 1 and 2 will have a maximum duration of 48 months, whilst for Action 3 the maximum duration for a project is 24 months.

Consortia

Projects must be delivered by consortia, as follows:-

For Action 1 – there are 2 options:-

1. a minimum of 2 EU institutions from different EU Member States and 1 US institution, or
2. a minimum of 2 EU institutions from different EU Member States and 2 US institutions

For Actions 2 and 3 – consortia must include at least 2 EU institutions from different EU Member States and 2 US institutions

Funding available

The European Commission will provide funding for the direct use of the EU partners and the US Department of Education (FIPSE) will provide funding for the direct use of US partners.

HEEFS will offer support and advice to any HEI interested in submitting a proposal or a tender against any of the calls made by the Commission. Support may take the form, for example, of:-

- Interpretation and explanation of the call documentation;
- Identification of opportunities and assistance with project design to meet requirements;
- Assistance with the preparation of a project proposal or a tender;
- Advice on costing for a project

Support for projects

HEEFS will offer support to any HEI that is successful in the application process. Support may take the form, for example, of:-

- Assisting the HEI to ensure that it is able to comply with contract requirements;
- Assistance with completion and submission of interim and final claims/reports;
- Where appropriate, management of elements of a project, (e.g. managing a network or providing management support);
- Assistance with dissemination of project outcomes via HEEFS contacts network.

The **Information** element of HEEFS support will be provided free of charge to all interested HEIs. HEEFS will however, seek to recover its costs in relation to **Support for applicant HEIs** and **Support for projects** through a levy charged on the funds awarded to HEIs or by building its own costs into overall project costs. As rules governing Programmes differ, details will be negotiated with individual HEIs on a case by case basis.
